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Art. 1. Introduction

Name of the event: bp Ultimate Rally-Raid Portugal

Date of the event: March 16 to 22

Art. 1.1 Preamble

Automóvel Club de Portugal (ACP) are organising the bp Ultimate Rally-Raid Portugal (the “Event”), round of the 2026 FIM World Rally-Raid Championship Sporting Regulations (WRRCS). The event will take place in accordance with the relevant legal and administrative requirements of the host country, the Federação de Motociclismo de Portugal (FMP), and the relevant FIM documents, including the:

1. FIM Sporting Code
2. FIM Rally-Raid Appendices
3. FIM Rally-Raid Technical Regulations
4. FIM Disciplinary Code
5. FIM Environmental Code
6. FIM Medical Code
7. FIM Anti-Doping Code
8. FIM Ethical Code
9. FIM Sound Regulations

These regulations are supplemented and amended from time to time and published on the FIM website: <https://www.fim-moto.com/en/documents>

Thereto, as well as the present Supplementary Regulations and any rules and regulations adopted by the FIM International Jury. The present Supplementary Regulations may not be in contradiction with the FIM Rules and Codes, including but not limited to the Sporting and Technical Rules applicable to the discipline. In the case of a divergence or conflict between these Regulations and any of the applicable FIM Rules and Codes, the latter shall prevail.

The various documents will be written in English and Portuguese. In case of any discrepancy the English text will be binding.

In any matter not covered by the FIM World Rally-Raid Championship Regulations or by these Supplementary Regulations, the FIM International Jury shall decide ex aequo et bono.

All additional provisions of a technical or organizational nature not contained in these Supplementary Regulations will be announced by means of a numbered, dated and signed addendum.

Such an addenda will form an integral part of the Supplementary Regulations and shall be posted on the official noticeboard of the Rally. They will also be communicated during the competitor’s briefing and the competitors will be notified in the shortest time practicable.

The bp Ultimate Rally-Raid Portugal 25 is organized by the Automóvel Club de Portugal (ACP), and takes place mainly in Portugal, part of stage 2 and 4, all of stages 1 and 5, in the Alentejo and Ribatejo regions. But has part of stage 2 and 4, all of stage 3 in Spain, in the community of Extremadura, with the support of the local club, MCV Motorsport.

The organization declines all responsibility in the event of theft or damage to equipment within the various structures of the organization.

Art. 4.4.3 Access to the Rally

Access to the rally is exclusively reserved for people having paid the applicable fees corresponding to the identification wristband of the bp Ultimate Rally-Raid Portugal (competitors, service, organization, press, VIP) and to vehicles officially registered. Any offense will result in the obligation to pay the applicable entry fees of the non-accredited person and may entail the payment of additional fees to the organizer, being reported to the Stewards who may impose a penalty up to Disqualification. Checking by the organization of this identification will be systematic at each meal, and at each service point and zone. Presentation of the identity wristband is compulsory each time it is requested by the organizer or their representatives.

In the case where the wristband becomes damaged, the person must get the wristband replaced by the competitor's service, in exchange for damaged items.

Art. 4.5 Entry fee refunds

The entry fee shall be refunded in full:

- if the event does not take place
- to teams whose entry application is rejected.

The organiser may partially refund entry fees if a competitor cannot take part in the event due to a duly proved case of force majeure.

Subject to the application reaching the organiser per email.

The deduction will be:

- 25 % of the entry fees for requests received until 30 days before the administrative checks
- 50 % of the entry fees for requests received until 8 days before the administrative checks

There will always be a deduction of 25% (file fee).

Other situations of *force majeure* not mentioned are subject to analysis and approval of the Organising Committee.

Art.5 Insurance Cover

According to Art. 110.1.1 of the FIM Sporting Code.

Art. 5.1. Repatriation Insurance

The Organizer shall entrust to a third party the implementation of the support/repatriation services from which the people taking part in the Event, which conditions shall be shown in Appendix 9 and 11 (for further details, see the Terms and Conditions of Sale).

Medical expenses and individual accident insurances – subscription strongly recommended.

Art.6 Advertising and Identification

According to Art. 7.5 and, Art. 7.6 of FIM WRRCSR

The organiser will provide each competitor with the advertising and identification panels, which must be affixed to their vehicles in the stated positions prior to scrutineering. **It is not allowed to cut the panels.**

Art. 8.1 Refuelling Zone and Commercial Filling Stations

The team is responsible for the refuelling.

A Refuelling Zone (RZ) will be installed adjacent to the Bivouac, Grândola, Badajoz and Loulé (See Appendix 6, 7 and 8) which can be used by the teams, using their own fuel and complying with the safety rules required by the articles above mentioned.

The Road Book, Maps and Itinerary indicate the public filling stations where it is allowed to fill.

Refuelling is allowed only:

- At local public filling stations on routes indicated in the Roadbook (at the competitor's expense),
- At the official refuelling (RZ) zone set up by ACP next to Bivouac's,

Commercial filling stations

The list of commercial filling stations is as follows:

- Published in the Appendix 12
- Published in the road book
- Published by means of a Daily Briefing / Info the day before each stage

The engine must be stopped during the entire refuelling operation.

Failure to comply with these clauses will result in penalties that can and may include exclusion from the Event. The sharing of fuel supply between riders is permitted.

Art. 8.2 Autonomy

- RallyGP, Rally2 and Quad, must have a minimum autonomy allowing them to cover 250 km, Rally3 must have a minimum autonomy allowing to cover 125km. For safety, an additional autonomy of 10 % is required. Each Rider is responsible for the calculation of his/her autonomy, he/she cannot,

under any circumstances, hold the Organisation liable if his/her vehicle cannot cover the minimum distances, whatever the nature of the terrain.

Art. 9 Administrative checks

Art. 9.1 Documents to be presented for each competitor:

To keep the time required for the administrative checks to the necessary minimum, make sure to bring and present the following documents:

- Riders' licence valid for the competition.
- ID cards/passports
- Riders valid driving licences.

Documents to be presented for each vehicle:

- Valid registration documents for the entered vehicle (temporary documents are not valid).
- Proof of insurance for the registered vehicle, valid in Portugal and Spain;
- If the rider is not the owner of the machine, the title of ownership together with an authorization from the owner for the loan of the machine to the rider for the rally must be presented.

It is the Rider's responsibility to present original valid documentation. No photocopies or certificates of loss or theft of any document will be accepted.

Art. 9.2 Timetable

Art. 10.1 Scrutineering, venue, and timetable

Vehicles may be presented at scrutineering by a representative of the team.

A time control (V2) will be installed immediately before the scrutineering area.

Any delay at the presentation at this time control will result in the following penalties:

from 1 to 15 minutes	150 €
from 16 to 30 minutes	250 €

> 60 minutes	Start may be denied

A time control (V3) will be installed immediately after scrutineering.

Art. 10.3 Scrutineering

The registered rider having completed the administrative checks must present themselves to technical checks with the following:

- Their machine.

- Their FIM homologated Helmets **with standard FRHPhe-02** (marked with the name of the rider and his/her blood type)

- Homologated airbags are mandatory (see Appendix 10 for homologated airbags).
- 3 Sets for replacement cartridges for airbag equipment.
- Stickers with competitor number and advertising must be in place.
- The mountings for safety and navigation systems must be affixed.
- The necessary power supply to support safety and navigation systems must be functional.

After technical checks, if a machine is found not to comply with the technical and/or safety regulations, the FIM Jury may set a deadline for the machine compliance.

Any machine which does not appear to comply with or is not adapted to rally standards during the technical checks could either be changed to another group, or will not be authorized to start (decision of the International Jury). In the latter case, entry fees will not be reimbursed.

The installation of the tracking system and the NAV-GPS will be checked at scrutineering.

Art. 10.4 Rider's safety equipment

See Appendix 10

Art. 10.5 Installation of the Safety Tracking System and Navigation System

See Appendix 4 and 5

Art. 10.5.1 Safety Tracking System

Each competitor must be equipped with the satellite tracking system IRITRACK.

All vehicles must have this system installed to complete technical checks.

For the duration of the rally, the competitor is held responsible for the proper functioning of this system. It must be in operation and remain permanently connected, power and antenna connected, throughout the duration of each stage. Any incident caused by the competitor (loss, destruction, de-tensioning, etc.) and/or any attempt of fraud or manipulation found will result in a penalty decided by the International FIM Jury and up to and including disqualification.

The manual switching on WITHOUT SAFETY REASONS of the alarm of the Tracking system (red button) will result in the competitor being financially responsible and may result in disqualification.

Competitors must contact directly the supplier for the rental of this device, and the purchase of any installation kit / accessories. A guaranteed deposit will be requested by the supplier.

Art. 10.5.2 Navigation System (ERTF)

Information regarding the installation of the devices is available on the supplier website (<https://www.ertf.com>). All motorcycles in the rally must be equipped with these systems, whose installation will be checked during preliminary technical inspection.

This system must function the whole time during a stage: the switching on of the equipment is the responsibility of the competitor. In all cases where the system is not functioning the competitor concerned will incur a one-hour penalty.

Art. 11 Other procedures and regulations

Art. 11.1 Riders' Briefing(s)

See programme (SR Art. 3)

At the first briefing of the event, the participation of the rider is compulsory. Any rider not attending the pre-event briefing will incur a penalty of 100,00 €.

Art. 11.1.2 Daily Briefing

See programme (SR Art.3)

Publication of the Daily Briefing on the Official DNB

Art. 11.2 Pre-Start Area

There will be no starting area organised.

Art. 11.3 Ceremonial Start

See programme (SR Art.3)

Racing clothes are not compulsory. Only the helmet is compulsory.

Art. 11.4 Accident assistance

It is reminded that ethics require stopping when an accident is witnessed by a competitor to ensure the most appropriate mode of intervention, with his intervention and the arrival of help.

In addition, important means are being implemented to shorten intervention times.

Any competitor witnessing an accident putting another competitor in physical danger must:

- Stop,

- Press the red button of the tracking device,

- Contact, if needed, race control through the tracking device,

- Wait for the arrival of help or another competitor,

- Press the green button of the tracking device to signal that he is leaving.

The stopping time between the 2 tracking system alerts (green button) will be deducted on the same day as the selective section, only for the first two riders stopped on the accident, at the request of the competitor on his arrival after the stage.

Each rider must carry a small first-aid medical kit, as per Art. 27.1 of the FIM WRRCSR.

This kit is to be presented during scrutineering/technical checks.

Art. 11.4.1 Starts for the Stage 1 and Stage 5

Stage 1 consists of two SS. Between the end of SS1 and the start of SS2, there is a regrouping with Parc Ferme rules.

At the entrance to the regrouping, the time of presentation at the time control for leaving the regrouping park and starting SS2 will be recorded on the control card.

After the regrouping, the start interval of SS2 will be 2 (two) minutes between the 10 first riders, based on the entry order of the regrouping, and 1(one) minute for the others.

Art. 11.4.2 Starts for the Stage 5 – Section 7 (SS7)

Stage 5 consists of two SS. Between the end of SS6 and the start of SS7, there is a regrouping with Parc Ferme rules.

At the entrance to the regrouping, the time of presentation at the time control for leaving the regrouping park and starting SS7 will be recorded on the control card.

After the regrouping, the start interval of SS7 will be 2 (two) minutes between the 10 first riders, based on the entry order of the regrouping, and 1(one) minute for the others.

Art. 11.5 Starting procedures and order

According to Art.17 of the FIM WRRCSR

Starting intervals for the Prologue:

RALLYGP: every 2 minutes

RALLY2/RALLY3/QUADS: every 1 minute

Starting order for the first Stage

The starting order for the first stage will be established according to the provisions of FIM WRRCSR Art. 17.3

Starting Order for subsequent stages:

According to Art.17.4 of the FIM WRRCSR

Starting intervals for the Stages:

- First 10 riders: 3 minutes interval
- From 10th to 20th: 2 minutes interval
- From 21st: 1 minute interval will start one at a time (or two at a time), every minute or every thirty seconds.

Art. 11.6 Electronic start procedure at Selective Sections

On the special stages the start will be given by an electronic system of count down.

The electronic system shows Race Number and last 15 seconds countdown, followed by the GO word that will be blinking for 3 seconds.

The countdown will be discounted second by second and will be clearly visible by the rider from the starting position

A photocell placed 50 cm in front of the starting line will be used to detect jump starts.

Art. 11.7 Finish procedures

At the end of Stage 5, all vehicles are subject to Parc Fermé rules until the Parc Fermé is opened after expiration of the period for protest.

The prize-giving ceremony will take place at the Bivouac, on 22 March, see Programme.

Art. 11.8 Permitted early check-in.

Published every day in the Daily Briefing.

Art. 11.9 Official time used during the event.

Official time throughout the entire rally will be that of GMT Portuguese Time

Art. 11.10 Road books / Navigation and Waypoints / Crews Road Book

Road Book electronic mandatory for all categories.

For each rider, a waiting zone of 5 minutes dedicated to concentration is located at the DSS TC, before their starting time, where the Road Book for the Selective Section will be unlocked on entering the zone.

GENERAL

The Road Book is produced and controlled by professionals. No claim can be made against the information found in the Road Book.

The GPS code of each stage will be, and displayed at the Bivouac exit every morning.

The only items allowed on the competitor and his machine are the notes on the current Stage (official road book), the modifications of the opening team which can be included in the Road Book. The corrections taken during a first passage will be accepted during a second passage in case selective section is repeated. Possession of maps given by the organizer is permitted except satellite photos.

The addition of any other notes on the road book, the rider and/or his machine such as: caps, geographical indications useful for navigation, distances, GPS points are strictly prohibited. Checks may be carried out and penalties applied as per Art.11.4 of the FIM WRRSR.

WAYPOINTS

The organizer has established the use of waypoints as defined by Art. 11.2 of the FIM WRRCSR. To control the respect of the itinerary, each diagram of the road book will correspond to a WPP, if no other type of waypoint is indicated in this diagram. The passage of the vehicle through each waypoint is registered by the GPS and it will be shown on the screen the number associated to this diagram in the road book. At the end of each stage, the GPS will be inspected to control the validation of the road book waypoints. In the event of an infringement, the competitor will be penalized by the Clerk of the Course, and the penalties will be according to the chart above.

SERVICE CREWS ROAD BOOK

Road books will be distributed through Sportity for the connections between Bivouac's.

On the loop stages, and when mentioned at the previous day's briefing, a Road Book or a Track will be made available to the Teams to reach the start or finish of the Selective Section where only light vehicles will be allowed. Heavy vehicles are required to remain within the Bivouac area.

Art. 11.11 Servicing of vehicles

Art. 11.11.1 Service (Assistance) Areas / Bivouacs

According to Art.18 of the FIM WRRCSR

The speed of vehicles in the service parks/bivouacs may not exceed *30 kph*.

From TC0 onwards, service of a competing vehicle may be carried out in Service Areas (Service Parks and Bivouacs).

Art. 11.12 Tyre Fitting Zone

Not applicable

Art.11.13 Prologue

The starting order for the prologue will be established according to the provisions of FIM WRRCSR Art. 17.2. The maximum time allowed for the prologue is 30 minutes.

Art.11.14 Speed Limited

According to Art. 7.1.1 / 2 / 3 and 4 of FIM WRRSR for the maximum speed by categories.

Regardless of the Speed Control Zones, the maximum speed will be limited to 120km/h and controlled on all Road Sections

Art. 11.15 Automatic checking in Transfer Zones

According to Art.15.4 FIM WRRCSR

The start time at the end of transfer Zones will be given by GPS.

Any possible false start, particularly one made before the signal has been given, will be penalized. The control of the respect of the target times for the "T" are the sole responsibility of the rider; If there is a divergence between the NEU entry/exit panels and the NAV-GPS, the information given by the NAV-GPS will prevail.

Art. 11.16 Broken down or out of use race vehicles.

Broken down or out of use race vehicles must be recovered by their service team. For a service vehicle to be able to assist a competitor stopped in the Selective Section, the representative of the team must ask for the authorization of the Clerk of the Course who will indicate how the intervention should be carried out.

The Organizer will have some recovery trucks to release the track, if needed, following the instructions of the Clerk of the Course. Any involvement of these vehicles following a competitor's request will be at the competitor's expense.

In the case of retirement, the rider must inform the Clerk of the Course. Riders who abandon their vehicle do so entirely at their responsibility. The organization can in no way be held responsible for the theft of their vehicle or parts of their vehicle.

Art. 11.17 Coverage

Competitors recognize that the bp Ultimate Rally-Raid Portugal 25 is a promotional operation via which they may benefit, due to the reputation they acquire. The company ACP holds to this end, the rights necessary for the production and transmission by any means and support, throughout the world, images relative to this event. The media disseminate information about the event via the press, radio, television, video, cinema, websites, etc., which in turn promotes competitors and their sponsors. These sponsors are therefore incited to help new competitors at further events. This enchainment effect is created thanks to the bp Ultimate Rally-Raid Portugal.

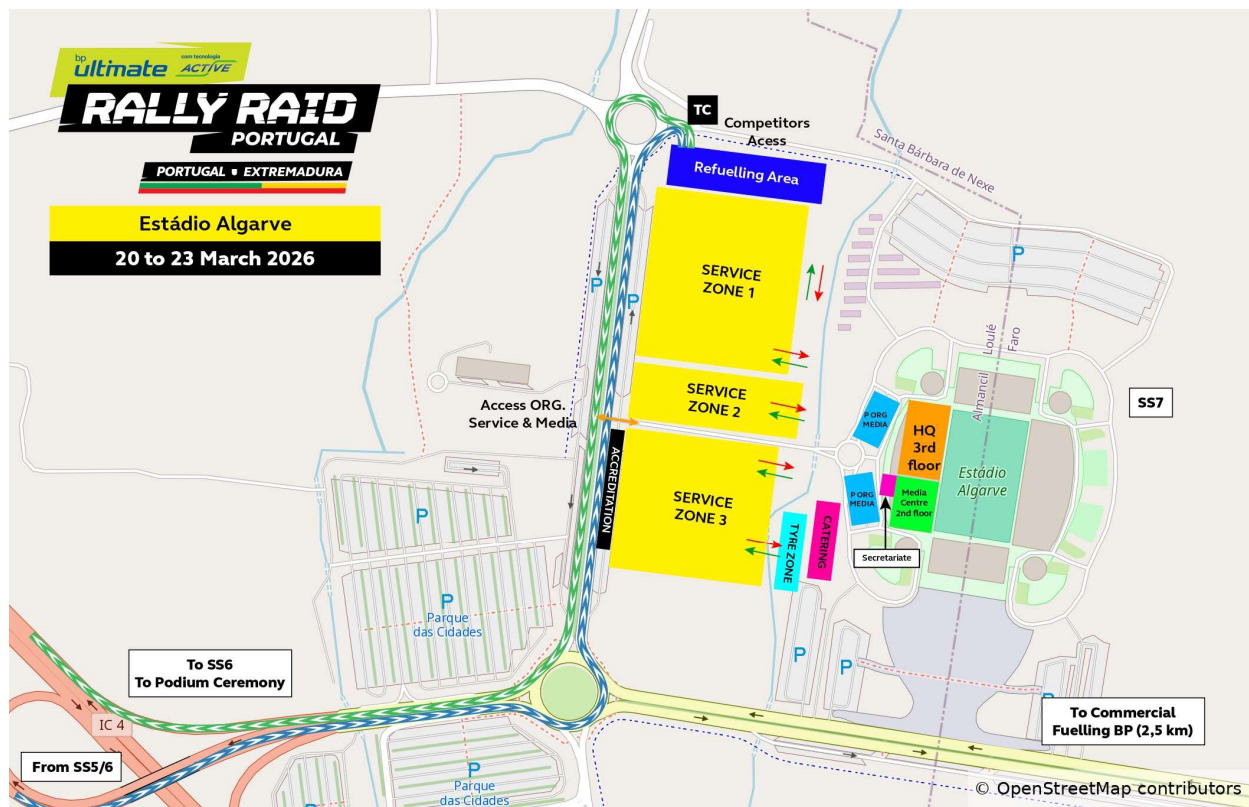
Appendix 6 Layout of BIVOUAC - GRÂNDOLA

FIM Riders' insurance information

The rider's insurance policy set up by the FIM is a service for all the Federations that are part of the programme for the period from January 1, 2026 to December 31, 2026.

Riders competing in MotoGP, Moto2, Moto3 and MotoE are not part of the FIM riders' insurance programme and must follow the guidelines of their respective Federation.

Who is covered:

- Riders with a FIM/CONU/NMFP/Training Camp licence issued by a Federation which is part of the FIM riders' insurance programme.
- Riders competing in a Cross-Country Rally or a Supercross event must follow the guideline of the organiser (Medical and Repatriation excesses).

Validity of the insurance:

- For all events on the FIM/CONUs/NMFP Calendars with an International Manifestation Number (IMN) or a National Manifestation open to Foreign Participation Number (NMFP).
- For racing activities included in the official programme of the event only!
- Travel to and from the event venue.

Scope of coverage:

In case of accident, the FIM riders' insurance programme would cover:

- **Emergency Medical treatment on the event's place** (subsidiary and complementary to any other insurances the rider may hold)
- **Repatriation to the rider's country of residence** (as declared on the FIM/CONU/NMFP/Training Camp licence extranet by the rider's FMN)
- **Death and Disability** (Riders with a FIM/CONU/NMFP/Training Camp licence issued by a Federation which has subscribed this benefit through the FIM program)

Coverage is provided only in the country (or countries) where the insured event takes place, which may be anywhere in the world including the insured's principal country of residence.

Please note that this is an EMERGENCY insurance and in order to avoid any problems please follow the correct procedure.

What to do?

Before departure:

- Always check beforehand whether your personal health insurance card is still valid.
- For European citizens, please travel with your European Health insurance card.

In case of an Emergency Incident /Urgent medical assistance need:

When contacting any of the claims team you will need to provide:

- Your FIM/CONU/NMFP/Training Camp licence number and your contact details

- The venue of the eve





Important notes:

- When you are being transported to hospital for medical examinations treatment and/or assessment:
 - Always take your documents related to your personal health insurance and to the FIM riders' insurance programme when you are being transported.
- When receiving medical assistance at the event/hospital:
 - You/a nominated representative must always receive a complete clinical record of all medical examinations, treatment and assessment.
- Always provide the insurance file number provided to you during your first call.



- Make sure your Federation indicates the correct country of residence in your details and your correct emergency and authorized contact persons. Any repatriation will be to the address/country provided by your Federation on the FIM Extranet site.
- The FIM riders' insurance programme is only valid at FIM/CONU/MNFP events with a valid Number (IMN) or NMFP. If you are attending private test and/or non-event practice days, YOU WILL NOT BE COVERED by the FIM insurance.
- Always follow the instructions or you may no longer be covered by the FIM riders' insurance programme!
- Please ensure you agree upon any medical care or medical arrangements with the FIM insurer before taking any action whatsoever!



- Do not delay in contacting the emergency helpline. Make the call as soon as you can to advise of your accident!
- Do not change or leave the hospital, before contacting the emergency claims line, or the FIM insurance services may not be provided.
- Do not leave the country in which the incident occurred, before contacting the emergency claims line, or the FIM Insurance services may not be provided.

Appendix 10– Excerpt from the FIM World Rally-Raid Championship TECHNICAL Regulations relating to protective clothing, helmets and any other safety requirements

All competitors are reminded of Art. 01.65 of the FIM World Rally-Raid Championship TECHNICAL Regulations.

The FIM cannot be held liable for any injuries that a rider or passenger may sustain from the use of a specific item of equipment or protective clothing.

For the entire course, the wearing of the following protections is compulsory, with a penalty of disqualification.

65.01 Clothing and protectors

It is compulsory that riders wear trousers, and a long-sleeve shirt.

...

Any modifications to the protectors remove the certification of the equipment and will not be accepted.

65.01.1 Airbags

It is compulsory that riders wear an eligible airbag for the competition.

...

The neck-brace is not compatible with the airbag and therefore is prohibited.

...

In addition, double-deployments/shots Airbags are compulsory

65.01.2 Limb joint protectors

It is recommended that riders wear limb joint protectors for knees, hips, elbow and shoulders.

The limb joint protectors, if present, must be certified according to the International standard:

- EN 1621-1:2012, Level 1 or 2

65.01.3 Back protector

It is compulsory that riders wear a back protector.

The back protector must be certified according to the International norm:

- EN 1621-2:2014, Level 1 or 2, only CB (Central Back) or FB (Full Back)

65.01.4 Chest protector

It is compulsory that riders wear a chest protector.

The chest protector must be certified according to the International norm:

- EN 1621-3:2018, Level 1 or 2

65.02 Footwear

Footwear, in a good condition, made of leather or other materials with equivalent properties, shall be worn and have a minimum height of 30 cm.

65.03 Gloves

Riders shall wear gloves made of leather or other materials with equivalent properties.

65.04 Eye protection

Riders shall wear goggles. The use of glasses, helmet visors and "roll offs" is also permitted. The use of "tear offs" is prohibited for environmental reasons. The material used for glasses, goggles and visors must be made of shatter-proof material. Helmet visors must not be an integral part of the helmet.

Eye protectors which cause visual disturbance (e.g. scratched) must not be used.

01.67 WEARING OF HELMETS

It is compulsory for all participants taking part in practice and races to wear a protective helmet.
